L2L White Paper

L2L has now reached the last month of the project lifecycle. After these years of exchanges, collaboration and researches, our partners from Finland, Italy, Ireland, Spain and France have finalized the main output of the project, the **L2L White Paper!**

The White Paper has the ambition to **guide the educators in identifying, collecting and assessing the competences** possessed by low-skilled people and to help them to choose training offers corresponding to their expectations and skills.

The White Paper includes:

- **best practices** about the **process of certification and validation of key competencies**, with a special focus on the Personal, Social and Learning to Learn Competence.
- A **self-assessment questionnaire** helping adult learners to evaluate the level of their Learning to Learn competences, which is one of the main skills supporting lifelong learning. So adult educators can also use the tool with their learners before and after their courses.

L2L face-to-face activities

From the **16th to 20th of May**, the L2L partners organized a **training activity in Sastamala, Finland**, with the objective of training teachers in the acquisition of common and shared methodologies for assessing the non-formal skills of low-skilled adults in relation to the "Personal, Social and Learning to Learn Competence".



Beside this training activity, the project partners met twice after summer holidays:

- In **Sastamala**, Finland, on the 11th of October to finalize the self-assessment questionnaire.
- In **Udine**, Italy, on the 2nd of December to discuss the finalization of the White Paper.



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
